JULY & AUGUST EXCERPTS FROM **HORNBY SCHOOL LOG-BOOK 1903 - 1990**

2 Jul, 1903 - Mr Danson SA Officer visited the school this morning and reported that he met Harry Thompson, Richard and Nelly Mashiter truanting in the field about Farleton. They came to school at noon.

27 Aug, 1903 - A very wet day, continuous rain for preceding night brought the river out in flood which caused Sarah Hodgson of Bridgend Cottage to leave school at 3.40 to get in the house before the flood came in.

25 Aug, 1908 - Thomas Blake, an infant, left and has arrived with his friends in Canada.

21 Aug, 1916 - Took the upper standards 4 to 7 to Claughton to see the old Church and Claughton Hall in the afternoon from 2.45pm to 4.15pm.

7 Jul, 1936 - Lancaster Corporation sent a man to repair drain which had been damaged by their workmen when laying the electric cable.

12 Jul, 1940 - Forwarded by the vicar a rough plan of the school and the steps taken for air raid precautions.

24 Aug, 1945 - Received word that senior scholars were not going to Burton in Lonsdale Modern School on September 4th but would be returning to this school.

7 Jul, 1952 - Only 23 children present all week. Tonsillitis at the Hostel. Mumps in the village.

8 Jul, 1953 - School closed for two days as an occasional holiday to enable farmers' children to go with their parents to the Royal North of England Show at Blackpool.

21 Jul, 1972 - The school children entertained the village with songs, dancing and playing at the Village Institute to mark the retirement of the Reverend J A Wedderburn as Vicar. The school made a presentation of a folding garden chair to the Vicar.

14 Jul, 1989 - Last day of school year. Also retirement of Mrs Sheila Ingleby, Deputy Head, Mrs Jean Webster, Nursery Assistant.

19 Jul, 1990 - We said 'goodbye' to Mrs Bullivant who is taking early retirement. She was an extremely dedicated teacher and hard worker for the school and community.

I went to Hornby School instead of Wray School in 1947 for just one year. My parents thought that having a change of school would be good for my discipline. I did enjoy my year at Hornby and found Mr Parkinson to be an interesting teacher.

Children who I remember from the class 1947-1948 were Brian Wilkinson who lived in one of the spite houses opposite the church. Other children were William Kelsall from Gressingham and Petr Ellis from Claughton, also Mary Ashton (now Mary McClements). Many children came from the Hornby Hostel for evacuees. I remember Joan Tavener, who I think was top of the class. She had a brother Charlie and came from London. Another girl was Ruby Horrocks who I believe did return to Hornby on a couple of occasions.

A boy who I remember well was Brian Taylor who came to Hornby Hostel in 1940 as a three year old, after his parents had died in the war.

After leaving Hornby Village School in 1948, all the children went to Burton-in-Lonsdale Secondary Modern School.

ANNE FENWICK'S LAND Andrew White

Among the papers in the Lancashire Record Office is this, a handbill originally belonging to Hornby's Roman Catholic presbytery.

I have written elsewhere about the brave claim made by Anne Fenwick against her brother-in-law, Thomas, after her husband, John Fenwick of Burrow Hall, had died. In the 18th century women had little right to property, unless there was a marriage settlement or some other device to give the widow a lifetime's interest if her husband died. Being a Catholic added a further dimension to the problem, as there were still many pitfalls to be overcome, and great unfairness. Anne succeeded, after a long legal battle taken to the House of Lords, in forcing Thomas to give her what was hers.

This handbill relates to the letting of three lots of land in Hornby in 1773, belonging to Mrs Fenwick, who lived at Hornby Hall, shortly after she had reacquired her rights and a few years before her death.

Recd 2/11/73
Hornby, December 3d, 1773.

To be Let to Farm,

~~For a TERM OF YEARS,~~
T O G E T H E R,

And Entered on at CANDLEMAS next,

*At the House of Mrs. Fenwick, in HORNBY,
on Monday the 13th of December, at four o'Clock
in the Evening.*

AN Estate at *Hornby*, called BUTTYEATS, containing about 80 Acres, with a large convenient slated House, and three large Barns, with an Orchard and Garden; the whole very convenient and pleasantly situated; with Right of Common upon *Whitmoor*.

ANOTHER Estate, called BEARS-HEAD, at *Hornby*, containing about 7 customary Acres.

Also another Estate, called GREETS, at *Hornby*, containing about 10 customary Acres.

For further Particulars inquire of Mrs. Fenwick, in *Hornby*.

The three lots can still be identified today.

Butt Yeats is the former farm at the junction of Station Road and the road to Wray and Bentham. The farmhouse and its three barns are still there, although divided into several properties.

Bears Head is a field on the left hand side of Station Road, going south. It may be named after a former inn, but this is by no means certain.

Greets is a series of large fields set between the Wenning and the A683 road to Lancaster, including what is now the playground and the sewage works. Romantic!

Small Billiard Table

The Secretary stated that he had got two estimates for repairs to the small billiard table for remodelling cushions and re-covering bed.

Rileys of Accrington estimate £30. Pembertons of Leeds £28.

J Halhead proposed, A Halhead seconded, that the table be repaired and the Pemberton's estimate be accepted.

Boiler

A discussion took place regarding electrifying the Central Heating System. It was thought that a cylinder and immersion heater would take the place of the Central Heating Boiler. This was left over for further enquiries.

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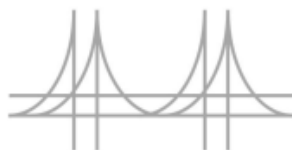
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
